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## LICENSED PERSON GREYHOUND BEHAVIOUR DECLARATION FORM:

### Rehoming to a private pet owner

This declaration has been prepared to assist you in privately rehoming your greyhound directly into a pet home safely, and smoothly.

Placing your greyhound successfully as a pet requires that you make an informed decision about how the personality and needs of your greyhound match the lifestyle, and expectations of their adopter.

The better the match, the greater the likelihood of your greyhound being successful in their transition to pet life.

By completing and signing this declaration and the Behaviour History Form, you are confirming that you have undertaken the following activities with your greyhound and will answer behaviour related questions accurately and honestly.

- Completed a 28-day (or more) wind down from all racing activities and transitioned your greyhound to a pet diet and daily routine
- Exposed your greyhound to a variety of new environments, experiences, unfamiliar people, and other animals, including but not limited to:
  - Leash walking in unfamiliar environments, such as suburban streets and parks, on footpaths, and on stairs
  - Introduced your greyhound to unfamiliar adults and children and encouraged positive interactions
  - Exposed your greyhound to common indoor household environments
  - Exposed your greyhound to other breeds of dog and species of animal, in a safe and positive manner
  - Time away from other greyhounds in a familiar environment to increase their tolerance for isolation
- Completed on-lead greetings with unfamiliar dogs of other breeds, of different sizes, with your greyhound and are confident that the greyhound does not display any of the behaviours in the declaration below.

If you are unable to declare all of these as a true and accurate representation of your greyhound's behaviour, please contact the Great Mates Team for a behavioural assessment to be completed. Your greyhound is not eligible for private rehoming if this declaration is not signed.

### Private Rehoming Behaviour Declaration

I have completed a wind down from racing activities, as detailed above, and confirm that the greyhound listed below has not displayed any of the following behaviours:

- **High level predatory interest\* in, or predatory grabbing\* of other dogs** of any breed or type, whether on or off lead at the time of the interaction.
- **High intensity predatory focus** on animals of any species, that is difficult or impossible to distract the greyhound from or makes the greyhound potentially unsafe to handle (e.g. the greyhound lunges and pulls on the lead and may pull over an inexperienced handler).
- **Intense or prolonged distress\* or fear\*** behaviours when exposed to an unfamiliar environment, unfamiliar people, or unfamiliar animals.
- **Use of aggression\***, including **growling, lip lifting, snapping at** (no skin contact) or **biting** (skin contact made), during normal daily interactions with people or other dogs.
- **Panic or distress behaviours** when left alone while isolated from other greyhounds.
- **\* Note: Greyhounds showing these behaviours in familiar environments must be immediately assessed and treated by an appropriately qualified veterinarian or canine behaviourist.**
