- Intense or prolonged distress* or fear* behaviours when exposed to an unfamiliar environment, unfamiliar people, or unfamiliar animals.
- Use of aggression*, including growling, lip lifting, snapping at (no skin contact) or biting (skin contact made), during normal daily interactions with people or other dogs.
